2. Opening remarks from the Chair

Geraldine Brown (President and Chair) welcomed everyone to the meeting, good to see as many representatives from our membership here. Wonderful to have everyone together to support the badminton and to participate in the course completed earlier in the week.

3. Presentation of Regional Development

Nadia Bleaken presented key initiatives and outcomes achieved during the 2014 year. Full notes on this presentation are available in the 2014 Annual report.

Key messages from Nadia included a need to revisit the Oceania Strategy, to confirm an aspirational and realistic programme that best utilises our resources for the betterment of our athletes.

Ian Wright delivered a message from the BWF thanking Oceania representatives for the invitation to attend the meeting. Ian spoke to the BWF's introduction to new standards for Coach accreditation that are tougher than previous qualifications but now will link into world qualification standards.

Ian presented the BWF Mission, Vision, Key Focus and Goals from the 2012 – 2016 Strategic Plan. Included in Ian's presentation was the role of BWF, and the resources they have been developed since 2012. All these resources are available online on the BWF website. Ian encouraged member associations to apply for Olympic Solidarity funding on an annual basis.

Geraldine Brown thanked both Nadia and Ian for their presentations.

Geraldine also formally welcomed Nadia Bleaken to the role of Chief Operating Officer and thanked her for her role as Regional Development Officer.

Thanks was also made to the ongoing support of the BWF and to Ian Wright for attending the AGM.

Nadia Bleaken spoke to the Annual Report in her role as Chief Operating Officer:

Paul Brettell congratulated Nadia on her appointment to the Chief Operating Officer role and noted the importance of appointing support personnel for Nadia over the next three months.

Loh Poh gave an overview of activities completed by the events committee and the events for 2015. Congratulating all involved for growing the quality and number of events in our region.

Geraldine Brown congratulated the Events team on the number of International players that are attending and competing in our events that will assist the growth and profile of our sport.

Sandra Low spoke to the importance of the Women in Sport programme and activating the initiatives within this strategy.
